NEWS FROM EUROPE

Can universities lead Europe out of crisis?

[...] Cooperation could create a better Europe. If member states would learn from each other in terms of what works and what does not work in university policy. [...] But even more important is the reclaiming of ground by European intellectuals inside and outside the university, who should organise themselves and overcome the crisis of trust between academia and society. Up to now, European countries have learned little from one another. [...]

Learning from one another with European correction facilities is a form of regulation. We can also use the forces of competition, either in addition or as an alternative. The idea behind competition is that students should be well informed about the qualities of individual degree courses in Europe and free to choose where they want to study, while the financial conditions would be the same as if they were to study in their home country. Subsequently, the universities that are good at attracting students would be rewarded. The forces of competition in higher education have not been exploited in Europe, mostly because the quality of higher education has been difficult to measure. Increasingly, however, good measures are available, not in the least thanks to the EU-project on Multidimensional Ranking and the OECD's AHELO project. Competition would create an upward quality spiral, increase student mobility and prepare students better for an increasingly international labour market. [...]

A new university in Moscow: Skolkovo Institute of Science and Technology (Skolkovo Tech)

Skolkovo Institute of Science and Technology is a new, modern, international university with a physical campus to be built in Skolkovo, just outside Moscow, Russia. The community will consist of 200 professors, 300 postdoctoral associates and 1200 students by the end of the decade. Skolkovo Tech is established in collaboration with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), who will assist in building the faculty in addition to assistance and guidance in defining and implementing the overall university structure and curriculum.

The university is designed to focus on innovation, as an engine of discovery and economic growth. To enable the focus on innovation, the university will be organized around problems and opportunities, asserting the primacy of facing the issues of society. rather than the isolated development of knowledge. The guiding principle of education is to unify science, technology, and engineering in support of innovation. Research programs will thus have a consideration of use, to ultimately impact the human condition, and valuable ideas will be accelerated from the laboratory towards commercialization and other forms of societal impact. [...]

Bologna reforms now implemented and widely accepted

Ten years after the formal introduction of bachelor and masters degrees at German higher education institutions in the wake of the Bologna reforms, most courses have been adapted to the new degree system. Statistics suggest that the new degrees have found acceptance among students and industry. [...] Germany's higher education system has received much criticism for its drawn-out implementation of the reforms, although by last winter semester, 85% of its more than 15,000 study courses had been transformed in line with the Bologna concept and degree structure. The fachhochschulen, or universities of applied science, have been quicker to introduce the new degrees than traditional universities. [...] Half of the 2010 cohort of university graduates obtained their bachelor degrees after just 6.5 semesters of studying, whereas half of university students graduating from universities with a diplom, the old university degree, had taken up to 12.2 semesters, according to the education ministry. It claims this implies that the Bologna reforms have brought average study time in Germany closer to what the country's Higher Education Framework Law, adopted long before the Bologna reforms, had originally prescribed. [...]

The Bologna reforms also appear to promote student mobility. The number of German students enrolled abroad almost doubled from 1999-2009, to 115,000. By 2009, five percent more students were participating in the European Union's Erasmus programme. And nowadays, around a third of all German students gather at least some experience abroad.

NEWS FROM IRELAND

Students starting to see benefits of a career in engineering and technology

The attempts by industry and Government to impress upon students the benefits of a career in the engineering, science and technology sectors are starting to reap rewards, according to Director General of Engineers Ireland, John Power. He was speaking as the Leaving Certificate 2012 results were announced and ahead of the first set of CAO offers which are likely to show an increase in the point's requirements for many college courses in the engineering, technology and science areas. And with a significant increase in the number of students sitting the higher level Leaving Certificate maths paper also this year, Power said students are starting to recognise the real career possibilities in emerging sectors of the economy. "The likely increase in CAO points in many areas of engineering, science and technology this year shows that students are now recognising the benefits of a career in these areas. The bonus points now on offer are also a factor." [...]
